LAW

on the Approval of the Spatial Planning of the National Territory - Section IV - Human Settlements Network

The Parliament of Romania has endorsed this Law.

Art. 1. – The Spatial Planning of the National Territory – Section IV – Human Settlements Network has been passed according to Annexes I-V that are part of the present Law.

Art. 2. – (1) The national network of human settlements consists of urban and rural settlements, in a hierarchical system by ranks in accordance with Annexes II-IV.

(2) Under this Law the hierarchical system by ranks is as follows:

- a) rank 0 – the Capital city of Romania, municipality of European importance;
- b) rank I – municipalities of national importance, with potential European influence;
- c) rank II – municipalities of inter-county, county importance or with a balancing role within the network of human settlements;
- d) rank III – cities;
- e) rank IV – villages as seats of communes;
- f) rank V – villages in the communes and villages in the territories of municipalities and cities.

Art. 3. – (1) Settlements can change their rank, following a proposal by local councils and consultation of the population through referendum and the institutions concerned, in comply with the minimal quantitative and qualitative indicators stipulated in Annex II on urban settlements and in Annex IV on rural settlements.

(2) The main indicators, the components and the level of facilities provided by the law for ranking urban and rural settlements shall be used as criteria for the establishment of taxes and tariffs.

Art. 4. – In areas with no towns or cities within a range of 25-30 km the Government, with the contribution of the local public authorities of the administration, shall take priority action for:

- a) modernizing the rural settlements which provide services in their area of influence;
- b) declaring new cities, through special programs of co-participation in the financial support for the institutional development necessary for the new cities.

Art. 5. – New communes shall be organized as provided by the law, following a proposal by the local council and a consultation through referendum of the local population in the territorial-administrative unit the villages are part of and of the population in the territorial-administrative unit which would take over the respective villages, supported by documents certifying compliance with the minimal conditions provided by Annex IV.

Art. 6. – For a balanced development of urban and rural settlements the Government in co-operation with the local public authorities of the administration shall take action for support and revival of the communes, specified in Annexes IV and V, whose population decreased severely in the past 30 years.

Art. 7. – (1) For a balanced development of the areas surrounding the Capital city of Romania and the municipalities of rank I, the territorial-administrative units in these areas can enter into voluntary partnerships with a view to creating metropolitan areas around the urban spaces. Such associations would enhance the complementarity of the

respective units and the decision-making bodies interested in the development of the territory.

(2) The metropolitan areas provided in (1) shall act as independent non-legal entities.

(3) The metropolitan areas could function within limits that are independent from the territorial-administrative boundaries, as agreed upon by the authorities of the local public administration.

Art. 8. – The association of the metropolitan area, with the agreement of the local councils and after consultation of the population within the established limits as provided by the law, shall adopt the development program of the area.

Art. 9. – With a view to optimizing the evolution of the large urban agglomerations, development zones can be created within their limits. Their boundaries, period of existence, institutional framework and the incentives granted shall be provided by the law.

Art. 10. - With a view to protecting the natural spaces, preventing the uncontrolled expansion of urban settlements and ensuring relaxation and recreation spaces, the urban plans prepared and approved by the law shall provide for the establishment of green belts or green areas around the Capital city of Romania and the municipalities of rank I.

Art. 11. – The national and regional development plans, the cross-border development plans and the plans for integration into the European space as well as the sectorial plans shall be prepared in accordance with the sections of the Spatial Planning of the National Territory – Transport and Communication, Water, Heritage Areas, Network of Human Settlements, Zones of Natural Risks and of other sections of the Spatial Planning of the National Territory approved by the law.

Art. 12. – Non-compliance with the provisions of this Law entails the annulment of the acts including the measures and development provisions listed in art.11.

Art. 13. – The authorities of central and local public administration shall cooperate to ensure the enforcement of the provisions of this Law.

DEFINITION
of main terms used in the Law

1. *Settlement*
- form of stable habitation of population in the territory, creating a nucleus of human life, of variable structure and size, differentiated according to the specific activity of the inhabitants, the characteristics of the territorial-administrative organization, the number of inhabitants, the character of the housing stock, the level of social and cultural endowment and of technical infrastructure.
Depending on the character and weight of the dominant economic activity, the number of inhabitants, the character of the housing stock, population and housing density, the level of social and cultural endowment and the technical infrastructure, settlements can be divided into two main groups: urban settlements and rural settlements.
2. *Urban settlement*
- a settlement in which most of the labour force is engaged in non-agricultural activities, with a high level of services and infrastructure, exerting a constant and significant social and economic influence in the surrounding area.
3. *Rural settlement (village)*
- a settlement in which:
 - a) most of the labour force is concentrated in agriculture, forestry and fishing, providing a specific and viable living environment for its inhabitants and which shall preserve its specific rural character in the future after modernization;
 - b) most of the labour force is engaged in fields other than agriculture, forestry, fishing, but is not yet sufficiently equipped to be declared a town and which will evolve towards the urban type of settlements by policies of infrastructure development and modernization.
4. *Administrative – territorial - units*
- as provided by the law, the administrative-territorial units are the communes, towns and counties. The basic administrative-territorial units are the towns and communes consisting of one or more settlements.
5. *Town*
- basic administrative-territorial unit consisting of one single urban settlement or of more settlements, of which at least one is an urban settlement.
As a basic administrative-territorial unit and as a socio-economic and geographic system the town has two components:
 - a) the territorial component – the *built-up area*, representing the area reserved for buildings or future development

(housing, social and cultural services, industrial buildings, warehouses, traffic, recreation, trade etc.) and the *hinterland*, representing the remaining areas of the administrative territory of the town;

- b) the demographic, socio-economic component consisting of population groups and economic, social, political and administrative activities that are carried out on the territory of the settlement.

The size, character and functions of towns vary widely, their development being closely related to that of their territory.

Towns having an outstanding importance in the economic, social, political, cultural and scientific life of the country or have opportunities for development in these respects are declared municipalities.

6. *Commune*

- basic administrative-territorial unit gathering rural population linked by a community of interests and traditions, consisting of one or several villages, depending upon their economic, social, cultural, geographic and demographic conditions. Villages that are the residence of the public authorities are central villages.

7. *Administrative territory*

- area defined by the law for counties, municipalities, towns and communes. It comprises agricultural area (tillable land, pastures, hayfields, vineyards and orchards), forests, built-up areas, infrastructure (roads, other than those in the public domain of the state, energy infrastructure, water management), rivers and lakes and the built-up area of the settlement (buildings and infrastructure), as defined by the urban plans.

8. *Network of settlements*

- all the settlements on a territory (national, county, functional area) whose existence and development is linked to a number of relations developing on multiple levels (political, administrative, social, cultural, economic etc.). The network of settlements consists of urban settlements and rural settlements.

9. *Hierarchical functional system of urban and rural settlements*

- ranking of settlements according to their importance within the network of settlements and their role in the territory, providing an economically and socially efficient service system for the population, and a balanced development of the settlements in the territory.

10. *Rank*

- expression of the present and near future importance of a settlement within the network from administrative, political, social, economic, cultural etc. points of view, with reference to the size of its area of influence and the decision making level involved in resource allocation. This

importance should also be reflected in the level of modernization.

- 11. *Metropolitan area* - area created through the voluntary partnership of large urban centres (the capital city of Romania and municipalities of rank I) and the urban and rural settlements in their immediate surroundings, within a radius of 30 km, based on multi-level cooperation.
- 12. *Green belt* - area defined around the capital city of Romania and the municipalities of rank I, with a view to protecting the natural environment, preventing the uncontrolled expansion of these municipalities and providing additional recreation spaces.
- 13. *Development zone* - an area defined within the administrative territory of a municipality or within a metropolitan area, for which fiscal incentives are proposed, in order to stimulate economic development by attracting foreign and domestic investment capital.
- 14. *Area of influence* - the territory and the settlements surrounding an urban centre and directly influenced by the evolution of the town and its relations of interdependence and cooperation evolving as a result of economic activities, food supply, provision of infrastructure and recreation and tourism facilities and access to social and commercial services. The dimension of the area of influence is directly related to the size and functions of the polarizing urban centre.
- 15. *Urban system* - system of neighbouring settlements that establish relations of cooperation in economic, social and cultural, spatial planning, environmental protection and technical infrastructure matters, while preserving their administrative autonomy.

3.0 Elements and level of endowment of urban settlements of rank 0 and urban settlements of rank I

3.1. Favorable geographical location:

Geostrategical location of international or European interest, development and attraction centres, positioned along the major transport corridors of international/European importance.

3.2 Population:

- a) significant number of inhabitants; minimum 200,000 inhabitants;
- b) highly specialized professional training: highly skilled labour force, permanent training of a flexible/dynamic character;
- c) identity: a well defined specific character and awareness of belonging to the group of cities of the same rank.

3.3. Accessibility:

At an international, pan-European level: direct access to the major pan-European transport system (by road, railway, water and air).

At a national level: access to the national transport system (highways, express roads, highspeed railways, marine and river transport, ports, airports).

3.4 Economic functions: high technology and flexible economic activities (secondary sector, production services, social and cultural activities, informatics).

3.5 Level of services and infrastructure:

The settlements provide the potential for accomodating/receiving functions and equipment of importance, quality and capacity complying with the European standards/requirements. The international and European character of these settlements stays in the international or European character and dimension of their functions and equipment.

3.6. Main categories and types of facilities and equipment for ranks 0 and I:

- institutions for political, regulatory and economic decision making of international, national and regional importance:
- Parliament, Government, ministeries and other central institutions, supreme courts (Supreme Court of Justice, Constitutional Court, Legislative Council), embassies etc;
- Seats of the local public administration, centres of decentralized services of ministeries and other central bodies in the territory, courts, tribunals, prosecutors office, headquarters of political organizations, of trade unions, foundations, NGOs etc;
- national and regional institutions of international/European repute or activating in the field of international/European relations:
- seats of the branches of international bodies, of large national scientific institutions of international/European importance (academy, national research centres and institutions etc.);
- venues for congresses and conferences, for exhibitions and fairs, large and luxury class hotels, international schools, offices of internationally recognized professions, of international arbitration etc.;
- permanent headquarters of foreign and international
- foreign companies and banks, other social-economic, cultural and scientific institutions,

- institutions: international non-governmental organizations, foreign scientific institutions (schools, universities), consulates and other diplomatic, commercial, tourism offices, etc.;
- various organizations with branches and agencies abroad:
 - banking, financial and insurance offices, offices of cultural and scientific organizations;
 - other facilities/equipments:
 - education, scientific research:
 - universities, diversified institutions of higher education, national research institutions and their branches;
 - health care:
 - university clinics and hospitals;
 - culture:
 - museums, theatres for drama, comedy, music-hall, puppets, opera, operetta, philharmonic concert hall, polyvalent halls, large libraries, publishing houses, printing houses;
 - commerce, commercial services for the population and companies:
 - commercial and business centres, stock and commodities exchanges, diversified and high quality commercial services;
 - mass-media:
 - system of international/European dissemination and coverage, press agencies, national and regional radio and television companies;
 - sports, leisure:
 - sports complexes, stadiums, sports halls for international/European, national or regional competitions, swimming pools, artificial skating rings, diversified tourist and leisure services, parks, botanical and zoological gardens, casinos, sports and leisure clubs;
 - environmental protection:
 - environmental protection agencies and ecological services with specific equipment for the provision of a high quality environment (organizing environmental audit, urban hygiene etc.);
 - water supply and sewage:
 - water supply networks, system of sewage mains, wastewater treatment plant;
 - cult:
 - ecumenic centres, metropolitan and bishopry seats, centres of authorized cults;
 - transport/communication:
 - international airports, railway terminals connected to the European network, postal services of international coverage;
 - public order, national defense and security:
 - specific institutions and connections with international organizations.

4.0. Elements and level of endowment of urban settlements of rank II

5.1. Municipalities – county seats

- 4.1.1. Population - between 50,000 and 200,000 inhab.
- zone of influence: about 200,000- 500,000 inhab.
- 4.1.2. Servicing radius: about 60-80 km
- 4.1.3. Access to transport: direct access to at least two major transport systems (main railway, national roads generating from or transiting the settlement, possibly airport, ports and/or river ports)
- 4.1.4. Economic activities: diversified production activities in the secondary sector, production, socio-cultural and information services of county radiance
- 4.1.5. Level of services and infrastructure:
- institutions for political, legal and economic decision making institutions of county importance:
 - Seats of the local public administration, centres of the decentralized services of the ministries and other central non-government bodies in the territory, headquarters of political organizations, of trade unions, of NGOs;
 - Courts, tribunals, prosecutors offices and other legal institutions;
 - education, scientific research:
 - higher- education institutions or their branches, colleges, national research institutions or their branches;

- health care and social assistance:
 - university clinical hospital or general hospital, specialized hospitals, county ambulance station, specialized clinical assistance (chronic diseases, disabled persons, functional recuperation, psychiatric centres), homes for elderly, recuperation centres, orphanages etc;
- culture:
 - cultural centres with performance halls, possibly theatres, concert halls, exhibition and conference halls, polyvalent halls, clubs, museums, libraries, publishing and printing houses etc.;
- commerce, commercial services for the population and companies:
 - commercial centres, chambers of commerce, business centres, stock and commodities exchanges, retailers and wholesalers, show rooms, diversified high quality services; conditions for organizing important fairs;
- tourism:
 - three-star hotels of minimum 200 beds;
- mass-media:
 - county mass media (radio and television companies), daily newspapers and periodicals;
- finance, banking, insurance:
 - branches of banking and insurance institutions;
- sports, leisure:
 - areas for leisure, zoological gardens, sports halls for national/regional, county level competitions, stadiums and other diversified facilities for leisure and sport (polyvalent halls, sports grounds, swimming pools, possibly artificial skating rings etc.);
- environmental protection:
 - environmental protection agencies and services with specific equipment for providing a quality environment and urban hygiene;
- water supply and sewage:
 - water supply networks, system of sewage mains, wastewater treatment plant;
- cult:
 - religious constructions, bishopries, diocese and vicarage seats, sub-centres of authorized cults;
- transport/communication:
 - railway terminals, bus terminals, public transport, automated telephone exchanges, fax, post office etc.;
- public order, security:
 - specific institutions of county level.

5.2. Other municipalities

4.2.1. Population: as a rule between 25,000 and about 70,000 inhabit.

4.2.2. Servicing radius: about 20 km

4.2.3. Access to transport: direct access to railway, national road, county road, and easy access of the settlements from the surrounding area

4.2.4. Economic activities: diversified production activities in the secondary and tertiary sectors, possibly including agriculture

4.2.5. Level of services and infrastructure:

- institutions for political, legal and economic decision making of county importance:
 - Seats of the local public administration, headquarters of political organizations, of trade unions and of other associations;
- education, scientific
 - Secondary schools, general and specialized high-

- research: schools, colleges, vocational schools;
- health care and social assistance:
 - branches of research institutions;
 - general hospital, county ambulance station, dispensary, new-born orphanages, day-care centres, homes for elderly;
- culture:
 - cultural centres, cinemas, public libraries, museums, exhibition halls, clubs etc.;
- commerce, commercial services for the population and companies:
 - diversified shops: supermarkets and specialized shops, food markets;
- tourism:
 - three-star hotels of minimum 50 beds;
- finance, banking, insurance:
 - branches of banking and insurance institutions;
- sports, leisure:
 - stadiums, sports grounds and halls (county and local level competitions), other spaces for sports, public gardens and other green areas for leisure;
- environmental protection:
 - services with specific equipment for environmental protection, monitoring of pollutants and urban hygiene;
- water supply and sewage:
 - watersupply networks, system of sewage mains, wastewater treatment plant;
- cult:
 - vicarage seats;
- transport/communication:
 - railway terminals, bus terminals, telephone exchanges;
- public order, security:
 - police, specific facilities.

5.0. Elements and level of endowment of urban settlements of rank III

- 5.1. Population:**
- as a rule between 5,000 and 30,000 inhabitants
 - in the influence area: between 5,000 and 40,000 inhabitants
- 5.2. Servicing radius:** about 10-20 km
- 5.3. Access to transport:** direct access to national or county road, to the centre of higher rank and easy links with the settlements in the influence area

- 5.5. Level of services and infrastructure:**
- public administration, legal authorities and associations: - city hall, law court, prosecutors office, tribunal, notary office, seats of various associations;
 - education: - kindergartens, primary, secondary and high schools;

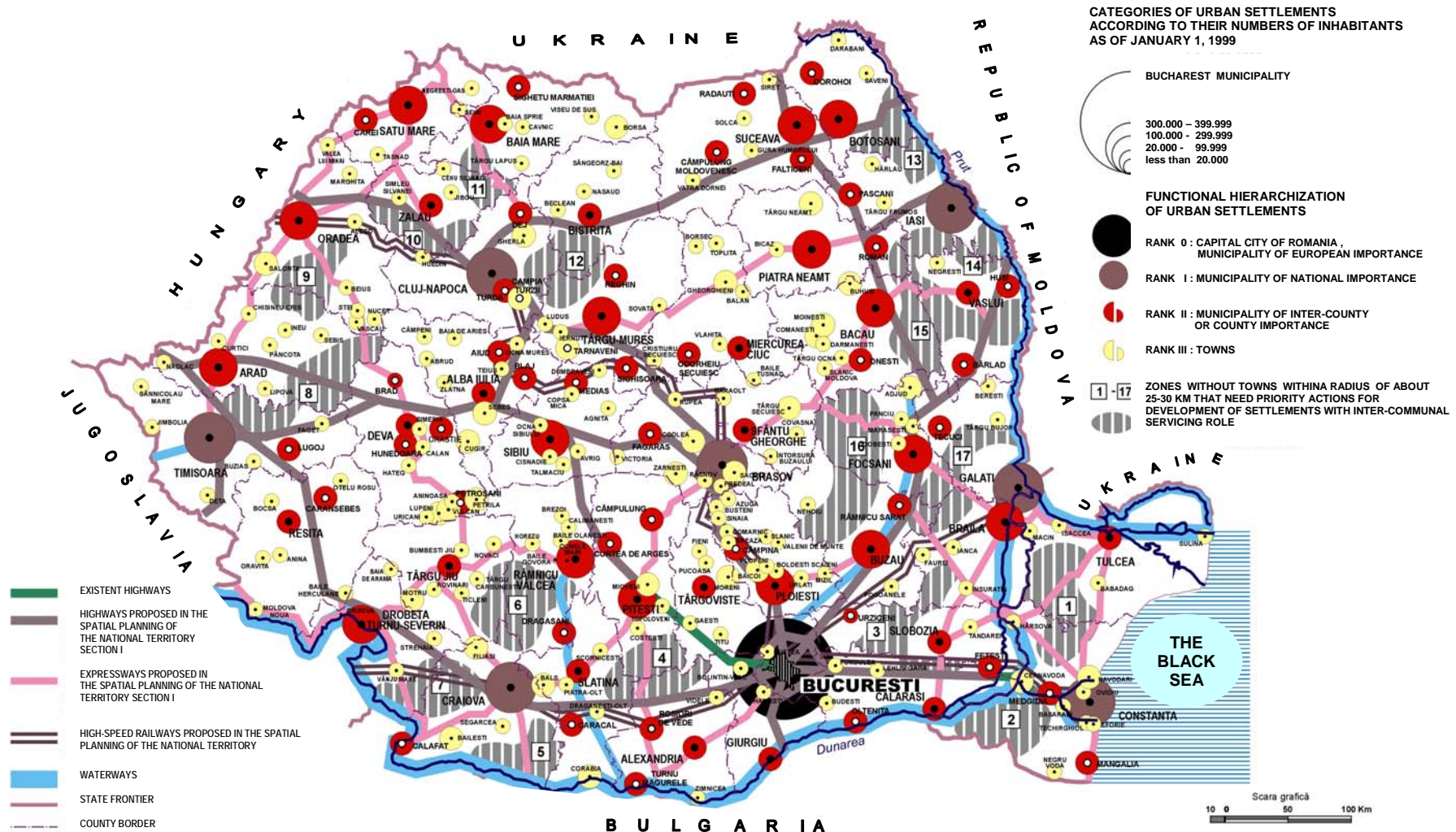

RURAL SETTLEMENTS

1.0. Hierarchization of rural settlements by rank

The hierarchy of rural settlements by rank is as follows:

No.	Rank	Status of the human settlement
1.1.	IV	Villages, seats of communes
1.2.	V	Constituent villages of the communes and villages under the jurisdiction of municipalities or towns

2.0. Elements and level of endowment of rural settlements of rank IV.

Rank IV is ascribed to villages as seats of communes. The minimum compulsory endowment necessary to provide servicing to the constituent villages of a commune is as follows:

- Commune hall premises;
- Kindergarten, primary and secondary school;
- Health centre, drug store or pharmaceutical shop;
- Post office, phone services;
- Police and gendarmerie station;
- Cultural club and library;
- General store, servicing shops;
- Arranged playing field;
- Church;
- Graveyard;
- Railway station/flag station or bus station;
- Veterinary centre;
- Fire-fighting station;
- Grounds for controlled disposal of wastes;
- Fresh water supply by street valves.

3.0. Elements and level of endowment of rank V rural settlements

Rank V is ascribed to constituent villages of the communes and villages under the jurisdiction of municipalities or towns. The existence of public or commercial facilities and their size depends on the number of inhabitants and the specific occupations of the inhabitants. The minimal compulsory endowments of the villages with more than 200 inhabitants include:

- Primary school;
- Medical first aid;
- Grocery's and non-grocery's shop.

Such endowments are also necessary in the villages with less than 200 inhabitants, if the respective villages are isolated, located 3 to 5 km far from the nearest village which has such endowments.

4.0. Necessary conditions for the declaration of a new commune

1.	Minimum population – 1,500 inhabitants
2.	Economic potential to ensure the budgetary balance of the commune
3.	Connections to roads or railways between the village seat of the commune and the other constituent villages
4.	Decrease of the distance between the village as seat of the commune and the other constituent villages
5.	Built up spaces for institutions and endowments*): <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Commune hall;- Primary and secondary schools;- Health centre, drug store or pharmaceutical shop;- Police station;- Railway station/flag station or bus stop
	*) After the establishment of the new commune a supplementation of the minimum compulsory endowment in the village seat of the commune is necessary, pursuant to point 2.0.

The conditions specified in point 4.0. shall also be fulfilled by the commune remaining after the declaration of the new commune.
